Housing Development in Stonesfield

Thanks to all those who wrote to WODC objecting to Pye Phase 2. There were over 90 letters of objection from Stonesfield residents. On Thursday 10 August the Parish Council also firmly rejected the application. We now have to wait for WODC's decision, which we think will be made in September/October.

Meanwhile, Sustainable Stonesfield wish to make it clear that Pye are applying for permission to develop land owned by Blenheim Estates, not by Charity Farm. Pye's use of the name Charity Farm for their planning application documents relating to Phase 2 has given rise to a false impression that the land for Phase 2 belongs to Charity Farm. It does not: it belongs to Blenheim Estates.

We made representations to the Inspector at the second examination of WODC's Local Plan, and we await the results. We are also waiting for the decision on CALA Homes.

A number of you have donated money to Sustainable Stonesfield, for which we are very grateful. It has been spent on commissioning two Landscape Assessments, one for the CALA Homes site on the Woodstock road, the other Pye Phase 2 site. Both will be used in our case against development in the AONB.

We fully support the letter written by Sue Corrigan to the County Council objecting to street lights being placed at the entrance to the Pye developments (see Nextdoor Stonesfield). The substitution of speed bumps for the chicane (which appears to have necessitated the lights) seems to have

been done without proper consultation and we would like to see it cancelled.

Changes to the Oxford Bus Service

Users of the S3 bus should not panic unduly about the apparent cutbacks to the Stonesfield service, as there are new journeys from the village on service 7 running via Water Eaton, for Parkway station, and Banbury Road, Summertown. These include the first Monday to Friday journey in, at 06.30 and the last back at 00.05 from Oxford.

Please remember to look at both S3 and 7 service timetables when planning your journey into the City as the new printed timetable is not combined. This is not ideal.

There was very little advance notice of these changes, which applied from mid August, as Stagecoach said the timetable took longer than expected to plan.

William Buckland (1784-1856)

Buckland was an eccentric English scientist, and the first Professor of Geology at Oxford University. Renowned for his highly entertaining lectures, he had a chaotic household, with rocks and fossils everywhere, kept a jackal and a bear for pets, and ate his way through the animal kingdom, trying out hedgehog, mouse, fly, crocodile, and many others. Apparently he also ate the heart of the French King Louis XIV!

He was president of the Geological Society of London, where he announced the discovery, at Stonesfield, of fossil bones of a giant reptile which he named Megalosaurus ('great lizard'). He wrote the first full account of what would later be called a dinosaur. Surely this marks Stonesfield out as a site of very significant geological and historical interest. We wonder what Buckland's response would be to his name being associated with a new housing development in an area of such ancient and geological significance?

convictions, it will be refused anyway. When there is a knock on your door, please make sure that your back door is locked before answering it.

which is incorrect.

SPC is still trying to fight the development by Cala Homes and has also objected to the new Pye Homes scheme. Neither of these two applications has gone before the Planning Committee at WODC yet. See online for more information www.westoxon.gov.uk. View Planning Applications.

New Chicane in Woodstock Road

SPC had very little input on the new chicane system in Woodstock Road. This was designed by OCC Highways and Pye Homes. The street lighting is compulsory when a speed cushion is incorporated in the layout. SPC appreciates that this cushion is very minimal as is the lighting!

Mobile Phone Mast

As mentioned previously, the mobile phone mast was rejected by the Planners. This will be resubmitted with the mast being placed in a significantly different location on the Playing Field. SPC supports this application as a necessity for better mobile coverage.

Glebe Land

We are delighted to inform you that the Parish Council has finally completed the purchase of part of the Glebe Land on behalf of the Scouts and will now become holding trustees, granting a long lease at a peppercorn rent on their behalf. The group will now be able to replace the old hut with a new build once funding is secured. We are sure that older members of the village will remember 'Andy's Den' as well as Andy himself, with fondness and thanks for all the years of fun this site has brought to the youngsters over the years. We wish them luck with their fundraising.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 14 September 2017 at the Village Hall. All residents are invited to attend.

West Oxfordshire District Council

The District Council has been somewhat pre-occupied with the consultation meetings for the emerging Local Plan. From a village point of view, it is encouraging that the Inspector is concerned about applications for development within the AONB. This, of course, brings into focus the application by Cala for the land to the north of the Woodstock Road. I intend to bring a motion to Planning for a moratorium on all such applications until such time that the Inspector's final report is to hand. I

am sure that the village will support this and will make a very strong case for the refusal of this proposal.

At the August meeting of the planning committee, several applications were received as 'retrospective' proposals. If there is one thing which I and other committee members dislike intensely, as does the Parish Council, it is the retrospective requests. The vast majority of these contain some element of 'trying to play the system'. Many contain elements which contravene regulations or are unneighbourly in some way.

It is now hoped that the Planning Inspector's report will be finalised late in the year. He has suggested some areas of further examination to be conducted by officers of the Council. At this stage, they do not appear too taxing, so we are hopeful that the final outcome will be acceptable and will enable the council to fulfill its duties to the benefit of our residents.

Fatbergs tackled 'head on' in West Oxfordshire

With the problem of recurring major blockages in Witney's sewers caused by fatbergs, people living in West Oxfordshire are reminded that cooking oil can be collected as part of their household recycling service. Fatbergs are putrid fatty masses that occur in the sewers when cooking oils, fats and unflushable items such as sanitary products mix together and solidify.

We also ask that people don't flush wipes, cotton buds, nappies and sanitary

products down toilets even if they are labelled as flushable. Our message is clear: bin it – don't block it.

In Witney, engineers from Thames Water clear at least three major blockages from the town's sewers every fortnight, while in the same period, 17 properties in Witney have been flooded with sewage as a result of fat and wipe blockages.

News from Robert Courts MP Horton General

The CCG (Clinical Commission Group) have proposed that the downgrade of maternity services from the Horton General in Banbury will become permanent. This will mean that the only obstetric unit in Oxfordshire will be at the already overstretched John Radcliffe in Oxford. Banbury will have a Midwife-Led Unit (MLU), which will provide the same maternity services as Chipping Norton Community Hospital. MLUs are a valuable resource for low-risk births, but having adequate obstetric care is essential to ensure the safety of mothers and babies.

The impact of this assessment goes far beyond just Banbury, but across the entirety of Oxfordshire. I share concerns held by many in West Oxfordshire that this is the thin end of the wedge. These plans are all very well until something goes wrong and mothers have to travel during labour from Banbury to the JR, risking the health of both mothers and babies. These proposals are unsafe, they are poorly thought through, the procedure is flawed.

I spoke recently at the Council's Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee (HOSC) meeting to discuss Oxfordshire Health bosses' proposals for changes of services at the Horton General. I was pleased that the CCG's decision will now be referred to the Secretary of State, and I shall do all I can to ensure that he is fully aware of my concerns, as well as those of my constituents and the local authority.

HOSC has already referred the temporary closure of obstetrics at the Horton in 2016 to the Secretary of State, and in 2008 the proposed downgrade of maternity services at the Horton was independently reviewed and overturned. We have a very strong case for this decision to be changed, and I will keep you all updated as soon as I learn anything further.

From your Parish Priest

Do you like to watch films? I do, well I guess certain films. I like films that give me a warm glow at the end of them. Films that have a good storyline and a clear message that good always prevails over injustice. Of course there are films that don't always work out that way.

J. John, the friend who sends me letters every month on all sorts of subjects, sent me one on a film he has just seen called *Silence*.

The film, he says, 'is based on an acclaimed work of historical fiction by the Japanese Catholic writer Shūsaku Endō. Set in seventeenth-century Japan at a time when, following the dramatic missionary-driven expansion of Christianity, the church was savagely suppressed, it recounts the story of two priests from Portugal who go to Japan to find a third who has gone missing and who they are told may, in the face of torture, have committed apostasy by

denying the faith. This is a time when being a believer was no easy matter; the punishment for the faithful was often imaginatively brutal, something the film doesn't spare us.'

It steps back from the feel good factor that I so love and tells the story warts and all. 'Scorsese', he says, 'seems to have gone out of his way to put people off. The nonbeliever might easily find the depiction of faith too uncritical, the believer find it too unsympathetic. There is something in *Silence* to unsettle everybody!'

I haven't seen it yet but I think I will have to work my way up to it. I prefer, I must admit, the new genre of 'super-hero' offerings where things are easily worked out as far as who is wearing the white hat and who is wearing the black hat!

The film, he says, reminds him of the fact that we all respond differently to the realities of life. He calls it our 'internal castle'. What I think he means is that we

very often construct a belief system inside us to justify our position and our support of things; we bend the facts to fit into our belief system one way or the other. In other words, if we believe in God then we fit what we know around that certainty. If we don't believe in God then we fit the facts around that 'internal castle' of unbelief.

I suppose it's true that we all filter life to fit our comfort zone. However, J. John says, for him, 'Silence unsettles all those certainties' whichever way we face with regard to the facts we experience.

He goes on to say, 'The genius of *Silence* is the way that it makes the viewer

uncomfortable. But then in this age of the armchair, where comfort is elevated over truth, perhaps we need to be made uncomfortable.'

However, what I find heartwarming as a Christian is that today, two million Japanese are Christians and churches can be found across the country. Many Christians live in Western Japan, where the missionaries' activities were greatest during the seventeenth century.

I hope you enjoyed my personal venture into 'the sound of *Silence*'!
