In their article in the November *Slate* the Parish Council confirm in writing that they will not knowingly agree to further lights in the village. I have received no other substantial response from the Parish Council so I am unable to tell you more.

One point needs to be put right. The Council suggests in its article that light pollution is little more than a concern for stargazers. This is mistaken. It is a wideranging environmental protection issue which is of concern to many public bodies, as well as a broad spectrum of their electorate. For instance, the Cotswold Conservation Board, which is responsible for the AONB, has a policy for the preservation of dark skies, acknowledged by local authorities in the area.

#### Sustainable Stonesfield

We are holding a second public meeting on Monday 15 January at 7.30 in the village hall. We want to report to the village on what we have achieved so far and enlist your support for the challenges that lie ahead. Planning applications are continuing to arrive and we are continuing to fight them on the grounds of violation of the AONB, over-crowding of our roads, inadequate sewerage systems and inappropriate numbers of unaffordable houses in a village which is not a rural service centre. Please come and hear what we have been up to and what we understand to be the current position. Come and let us know what you would like us to do and what you think about any of the issues that face our village.

We expect a revised planning application for the North Farm development to be lodged in the near future. The original application was for 16 houses – this is likely to double to more than 30 houses. At the time of going to press, the revised application has not been published by WODC. We will send an email to all residents who have signed up to Sustainable Stonesfield and also to Stonesfield Nextdoor as soon as the details have been made public and also put details on the Stonesfield website. As with other planning applications, we will put sample letters of objection on the Stonesfield website - please use them to voice your objection.

# Message in a Bottle (or a Wallet) scheme

Witney Lions Club is promoting a scheme to enable Emergency Services to readily locate medical details and contact information if called to a home in an emergency. The Club provides a small plastic bottle (free of charge) in which the user puts their emergency information: identity, contacts, allergies, list of medications. It is kept in the fridge, with green stickers provided with the bottle put on the outside of the fridge and inside the front door. All Emergency Services are aware of this scheme and are trained to look for these stickers.

The Message in a Wallet scheme is similar, with the card kept in the user's wallet so if they're in an accident away from home, anyone coming to their aid will have access to necessary information.

#### **Parish Council**

Phone Mast on the Playing Fields: Users of the playing fields need to be aware that it is anticipated that work will commence to erect a phone mast on the playing fields commencing on 27 November. The work will take approximately three weeks to complete. The contractors will be laying a temporary track around the perimeter of the field. The construction will involve temporary closure of some of the football pitches with disruption being kept to a minimum. Furthermore, the children's play area will have to be closed for three

days whilst a telephone cable is installed along the perimeter; the date for this has yet to be determined. The contractors have been briefed on the proximity of the children's play area to the access route and are fully aware of the need for safety to be the highest priority, having previously worked on a number of similar sites.

Cala Homes, Pye & North Farm developments: The planning application for 34 dwellings on land at North Farm remains unregistered at the time of going to press. There is still no information on Cala Homes nor the second phase of the Pye development.

**Glebe Land:** The steps and handrail have now been repaired.

New Website: The Stonesfield Parish Council's new website is under construction.

**Budget:** The Precept has been set for 2018-19.

**Allotments:** If you are interested in taking an allotment we have one full one available and a half one.

The Common: There will be a discussion on flora and fauna for the proposed new noticeboard for The Common. If you are interested in being involved with this project, please contact Cllr Geraldine Lawrence.

Blenheim Estates: The directors of Blenheim Palace will be attending the next Parish Council Meeting on Thursday 14 December. They would like to share the new strategy goals of Blenheim and seek feedback from those attending the meeting. As part of their commitment within the strategy, the directors wish to share all that they are doing and to seek engagement and support.

The next two Parish Council Meetings will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 14 December and on Thursday 11 January at the Village Hall. All residents are invited to attend.

# West Oxon District Council District Update

A great deal of my correspondence and phone calls have been related to the waste collection problems experienced across the district in the last two months. Although some difficulties were expected after introducing a new system, the scale of the collections missed was not. There are several reasons for this. A new contractor, new vehicles and, although the staff was transferred to the new company, many were on amended routes. Difficulties also arose because some collection points were inaccessible with the new larger vehicles. All this is probably little comfort to those whose bins were left, but I can assure you all that the staff are putting in many extra hours sorting out the problems and are hopeful that the backlog is being whittled down so

that collections will be returned to the standard that you all expect. Incidentally, if statistics interest you, there are a total of 582,335 collections each week. The scale of the missed collections amount to 0.09% at its height. Please accept my apologies on behalf of all the staff at WODC for the inconvenience which this has inevitably caused.

By the time you read this report, the Landscape and Heritage reports requested by the Government Inspector will be in the public domain. This means that the held-over planning applications, such as those affecting Stonesfield, will be brought before the Planning Committee at its December meeting on 4 December. I am sure that the interested parties including the village pressure group will give a good account of themselves at that meeting. For my part, I intend to express my views as strongly as I can. What the decision will be is impossible to predict. I am one of fourteen councillors making a final decision. I hope other councillors will hear, understand and sympathise with the plight of the village. It is sobering to realise that it has taken nigh on a thousand years for Stonesfield to grow gently to a total of about 600 dwellings. Now in one fell swoop that number will increase by over 30%. That the village will change is inevitable, should the decision favour the landowners and developers. I have fought two elections to the District Council, and one of the main planks of my appeal to the electorate was the preservation of the rural characteristics of our rural Oxfordshire villages. Now, I am faced with the possibility of being a part of the decision to change some of the most important characteristics of our village.

On a more cheerful note, there will shortly be a new telephone mast on the edge of the playing field giving us all better and more reliable service. Additionally, Ultrafast broadband is on its way. WODC has signed contracts with Gigaclear to bring fast service to those parts of rural West Oxfordshire still without.

Interestingly, WODC has entered into a groundbreaking arrangement with Blenheim Estates to provide as many as 300 new affordable homes. These would be discounted so that they would be attractive to young and not-so-young looking for a home in the area.

# Christmas waste and recycling information

Most of your Christmas waste can be recycled. Excess recycling can be put out in your black boxes, open cardboard boxes or clear bags. Glass must be separated and put in a recycling box. You can recycle small electrical items in your black boxes and textiles in a clear bag. Leave out your kitchen caddy for weekly collections too.

#### **Supporting Universal Credit applicants**

As a major part of government changes to the welfare system comes into effect in West Oxon at the end of November, residents making a new claim can be assured of support from the District Council.

Universal Credit merges several benefits and credits into a single payment replacing a number of existing benefits and tax credits. All new applications will need to be made online to the Department of Work and Pensions, with the applicant responsible for managing their own changes and making their own payments, such as rent and housing costs. WODC officers will be on hand to offer general advice and assist people with setting up their own accounts and with online form filling. Benefit applicants will be able to use computer terminals in council reception areas.

## **Oxfordshire County Council**

Apply online for primary school places Applications for children due to start primary school in September 2018 can now be made online. Families with children born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014 are urged to visit the primary school admissions pages on the county council's website to find out how to apply for places for next year. The council still accepts postal applications but recommends families apply online where possible, as it helps speed up the applications process. It also means families receive an automatic response confirming their application has been received and can be quickly notified if further information is needed. Those who apply online will receive an email on allocation day, 16 April 2018, informing them of the outcome of their application. Postal application forms are available from all Oxfordshire schools and from reception at County Hall in Oxford.

Help someone get online – be a digital helper at your local library

Volunteers able to give up just a few hours a week are being sought at branches across the county to provide one-to-one support for people with little or no experience of using computers or the internet. The aim of the campaign is to help people access services online including council services; access employment or training opportunities; become more independent; reduce isolation. 
