#### **SAFER** launch

Stonesfield Action For Enhancing Road Safety (SAFER) was formed in December to work for Stonesfield Parish Council in matters of road safety. This was in response to the report presented at the November Parish Council meeting which outlined the results of the October survey of residents' opinions on traffic, speed and signage.

SAFER steering group is chaired by a Parish Councillor assisted by a number of interested residents. SAFER's constitution and the members of the steering group can be found on the Parish Council website. SAFER is supported by Thames Valley Police (TVP) and PC Robert Webb has been representing TVP at the meetings.

The Parish Council has budgeted in 2019/20 to support actions to improve road safety and currently a range of options are being reviewed by SAFER. In the meantime, SAFER held a meeting in early January, attended by representatives from Bladon, North Leigh, Charlbury, Freeland and Fulbrook. The objective was to share expertise and knowledge. It was clear from the meeting that these communities had



very similar experiences and concerns. Many had been starting to address them over the last two or more years. This provided a useful basis for further cooperation between West Oxfordshire towns and villages in the area of road safety. # CALA's appeal and the Secretary of State's Inquiry

In May 2017 CALA Homes applied to WODC to build 68 houses in the field off the Woodstock Road. The site had provisionally been allocated for 50 houses in the District Council's Local Plan to 2031. The Parish Council and Sustainable Stonesfield made representations at the Local Plan Inquiry against this allocation, primarily on the grounds that it was a major development in the Cotswolds AONB. Over 200 residents also wrote against this unwanted development.

In January 2018 the Government's Inspector provisionally approved the new Local Plan. He had heeded the many representations against major development in the AONB and instructed the District Council to remove five sites from the Local Plan, including Woodstock Road. The District Council formally adopted the revised Local Plan in September 2018.

Instead of accepting that there was no longer a need to build 68 houses in Stonesfield, CALA persisted with their planning application. WODC heard the application in May 2018 and formally refused it.

Once again CALA chose to persist with their application and have appealed the Council's decision. The Parish Council and Sustainable Stonesfield are working together to become a 'Rule 6 party' at the Planning Inspectorate's Inquiry which will take place in the first week of April. We are jointly developing a strong statement of case against CALA's application. The recent adoption of the Local Plan that said the site wasn't required by WODC to meet its housing need, and that there are no 'exceptional circumstances' to warrant building in the AONB, are strongly in our favour. SPC and SUSTO will be calling upon expert witnesses to support our case: a housing numbers expert – especially local and affordable housing needs – and a landscape consultant. The Parish Council has agreed to fund the latter.

This is a very important battle to win as it will set a precedent for other sites in Stonesfield and the whole Cotswolds AONB. A very similar appeal has been made for a site in Burford which will be heard in early summer, and there will be others in future.

#### **Stonesfield Common**

We have set up a Scything Group to manage the growth of tough grasses and encroaching scrub on Stonesfield Common, to keep the Common a great place for a rich variety of insects, birds, mammals, and plants, including the beautiful and very rare Meadow Clary. The weather has been mostly good, new skills have been learnt, and areas of grass have been shorn, all while having a chat and making new friends. If you are interested in getting involved, tools and tuition will be provided (no prior experience required), and it is a great way to meet people and do something physical to help the ecology of the Common. Sheep returned to the Common in early January and will be there until April. Walkers please ensure the gates are always closed properly, dogs are well controlled (preferably on a lead) and you pick up dog mess. Thank you. Grazing with sheep is the best way to maintain the full diversity of life on the Common. As well as scything the tough grass, working parties have also been cutting back blackthorn, a very invasive species. Without control, blackthorn would take over large parts of the grassland.

#### The Wychwood Project Bird Aid

Farmland bird populations have declined by almost half since 1970, due to a variety of factors, including changes in farming practices. The Wychwood Bird Aid project aims to support feeding farmland birds through the winter, including tree sparrows, corn buntings, linnets and yellowhammers. There are more than 10 feeding sites on local farms, including in Stonesfield, with volunteers distributing seed and doing bird counts. Birds are fed oilseed rape, millet and crushed wheat on a daily basis, both spread on the ground and in hanging feeders. The birds have different requirements - yellowhammers need starch-based foods such as millet; linnets need oil-based foods such as rapeseed. A

big thank-you to Dave Holloway for support with storage of bird seed and feeding, and to all the local landowners who are involved in feeding on their land. If you would like to be involved with supporting this project, counting birds, or have a site that could be suitable for feeding farmland birds, please contact Judy at judy.anders66@gmail.com.

# Blenheim Estate acquires Pye Homes

Blenheim Estate has acquired its longstanding development partner Pye Homes along with its management team. The company is currently working with the Blenheim Estate on building 169 homes at Hanborough Gate and has just started work on 300 homes at Park View, east of Woodstock. This includes Blenheim's first Affordable Housing, with the affordable rental properties available at a 40% discount to the market rent. This new development will be the first to incorporate the principle of Landowner Legacy which recognises local landowners have a social, economic and moral responsibility to deliver developments that the local community can be proud of.

#### West Oxfordshire District Council District Report

The draft Budget for 2019/2020 shows a base budget of some £11,800,000, with the scale of fees and charges subject to a 2% rise. Council tax support continues to be available for households whose total weekly income is less than £385.

Those of our residents who regularly visit Burford Garden Centre will be interested to learn that the land west of Shilton Road (opposite the garden centre main entrance) has received planning approval for up to 91 new homes with a care/retirement complex. The design and layout of the proposed site is very attractive with green spaces and vernacular designed units.

Weaveley Arboretum has also been given approval for a new crematorium.

On the enforcement front, WODC has revealed a caseload of some 206 live cases. This is a large reduction on its recent figures and indicates that the increase in staffing levels has produced a significant effect.

The application for a vintage/veteran motor museum and lodges on the Enstone Airfield site is on-going with a new architect in Sir Norman Foster being appointed. The entire Development Control committee is scheduled to conduct a full site inspection later in March. The application has engendered a widely differing response from a variety of interested parties.

#### Making the most of food waste

WODC is providing additional food waste containers – anyone wanting an extra one can collect it directly from the Council's Town Centre Shop in Witney, Guildhall, Chipping Norton or Town Hall, Carterton. Food bin liners or recycling boxes can also be picked up for free. Official figures from WRAP (www.wrap.org.uk/food-drink) estimate that £810 worth of food is thrown away by the average UK family each year. Recycled food is put to good use generating electricity and liquid fertiliser for farmland, so recycle your unwanted food rather than putting it in the household rubbish wheelie bins.

#### Bigger wheelie bins for keen recyclers

West Oxfordshire residents wanting to recycle more can now swap to a larger recycling wheelie bin for free. The current blue-lidded bin for recycling materials is a standard 240 litre size; the new bin at 360 litres offers 50% more capacity. To order a bigger recycling bin, or any additional recycling containers, call 01993 861025 or email enquiries@westoxon.gov.uk.

#### Garden waste subscriptions

You can now sign up for garden waste collections, or renew your annual subscription to the service. The new collection year starts from 1 April 2019; residents signing up before the end of February can be sure of having their licence in time for the beginning of the new subscription year. The cost remains the same: £30 per bin a year for fortnightly wheeled-bin collections. To sign up call 01993 861025, or go online at www.westoxon.gov.uk/garden.

#### **Oxon County Council**

Woodstock Library: We are working to find a long-term solution for the Woodstock library; this will probably involve some difficult choices. The building has been deemed unsafe and needs to be totally rebuilt at a time when we do not have the funds for such an exercise. The library has temporarily moved to the Oxfordshire Museum [see Museum's separate entry. Editor] so the valuable library facility will continue in Woodstock whilst all options for its permanent location can be considered.

**Highways:** As part of the budget process we are working on the Highways capital work programme for the coming year, I am putting forward several roads across the division that are in need of structural repairs. These must be assessed alongside the network of almost 3,000 miles of road. A range of different methods of road repair and sealing are used (resurfacing, patching, Dragon patching, surface dressing) to extend the life of our roads and reduce the likelihood of potholes forming. The larger scale work is all done – a total of more than 322,000 square metres of road has been improved – and smaller patching and resurfacing projects are still being done all around the county.

Waste: OCC has welcomed the government's new Waste and Resources Strategy for England. It is based on the 'polluter pays' principal so producers rather than councils will meet the costs of collection, recycling and disposal of specific materials. This will hopefully incentivise producers and manufacturers to design their products and packaging to be more easily recycled.

Oxfordshire is the best recycling county in England, so we're well placed to help deliver the goals of this strategy. The current rate of 57% is good; we can do more by working with our District colleagues to increase the amount we recycle.

North Cotswold Line Taskforce: This is a group of councils along with Network Rail and First Great Western. Our ambition is to have two trains an hour to Oxford and London along with improved connections to the station.
