Notices

CALA development

The 16th of May was the day of closing statements on the CALA appeal to build 68 houses north of the Woodstock Road. SUSTO, the Parish Council and the AONB Conservation Board (the joint Rule 6 Party) have done their best to put the case to the Inspector that this development should not be permitted. The decision of the Local Plan Inspector six months ago to have the site removed from the Plan, and the District Council's subsequent planning committee decision to refuse permission, should be upheld.

CALA brought in a crack team of lawyers and expert witnesses, at no doubt vast expense, to argue the opposite.

This is the conclusion delivered by Jim Astle on behalf of the Rule 6 parties:

It is submitted that on the evidence before the Public Inquiry:

- There are no exceptional circumstances in the public interest to justify this major development in the AONB;
- The appeal proposal would not amount to sustainable development;
- The harm caused by the proposed development would overwhelmingly exceed any benefits, of which there are few if any;
- The appeal proposal would not be in accordance with the local development plan or any other material consideration;
- The appeal should therefore be dismissed.

A big thank you is due to everyone in the village who has written letters objecting to this proposal, to the Parish Council for joining us in this fight and paying for expert witnesses, to the whole of the SUSTO committee who have worked hard in various ways over the past three years and especially to Jim Astle for leading us at the appeal – we couldn't have done it without you. We now have to sit and wait with fingers crossed (and anything else you care to cross) for six to eight weeks to find out the Inspector's ruling.

Sadly, over the Easter Weekend, Stonesfield Preschool was a victim of trespass and criminal damage caused by unauthorised older kids being on the property. The incident has been reported to the police, but if anyone can shed any light on the matter, please let us know.

At the same time the defibrillator was found on the floor outside the building, which is believed to have been the result of a faulty cabinet. Since then, for safety reasons, the unit has had to be moved into the building. A new cabinet has been organised, and will be installed soon so the unit will be back and available for use by the community.

There was also an incident where damage was done to a vehicle parked on The Cross, outside Glovers Yard. Glovers Yard is a Residents Only car park, so not for general use, and is also the entry way for the Preschool. Please be mindful not to block the access, be extremely careful when manoeuvring around the area, and park in the allocated spaces on The Cross.



Politics & local affairs

Parish Council

The Parish Council held its monthly meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting on 13 May.

Wendy Gould and Frank Huddleston stood down as councillors this time and following an uncontested election Cllr David Brown, Cllr David Baldwin, Cllr Phil McArdell and Cllr Simon Powell were re-elected. Cllr Geraldine Lawrence and Cllr Jim O'Brien were re-elected via co-option. There are currently two vacancies for Councillors. Cllr David Brown was re-elected as Chairman and Cllr Phil McArdell was elected as Vice Chair.

The Parish Council would like to thank those who attended the APM and provided reports; these will be circulated with the minutes and posted on the website.

The 16th of May was the final day of the CALA homes hearing, and representatives from the Council attended. As soon as we hear any updates from the hearing we will pass this information on to you.

The Parish Council is subject to an annual audit. The end of year internal audit has now been completed by the clerk and the auditor. Phillip Hood was appointed as internal auditor and is generally pleased with the Council finances. The clerk sought the Council's approval in the full Council meeting and it has now been sent to external auditors for final sign off.

Minutes of the last meeting will be posted on the website next week.

The next Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 12 June at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

West Oxfordshire District Council

At the recent Annual Parish Meeting in Combe, I gave a very potted summary of the year's activities. It referred briefly to the Appeal Hearings for the Woodstock Road development in Stonesfield. This continued in May, with a decision announced probably in June/July.

It is almost to be expected that the District is still in conflict with Thames Water. The infrastructure in West Oxfordshire is antiquated and inadequate for the number of dwellings already in existence quite apart from the proposed developments. Thames Water is full of promises and hopes of improvements but little appears.

Combe, fortunately, has so far escaped the brunt of the building boom and sincerely hopes this happy state will continue.

At a time when elections seem to occupy much of the news, it would be remiss of me to fail to refer to my very good friend and ex-colleague in the Ward, Charles Cottrell-Dormer. Charles unexpectedly lost his seat on 2 May. He has served the people of West Oxfordshire for forty-eight years and has given exemplary service in many capacities, not least as Chairman of the Uplands Planning Committee. He will be greatly missed by his colleagues of all parties. His acerbic comments regarding the exaggerated claims of builders have delighted the committees over the years. I am saddened by his departure – another casualty, perhaps, of the mishandled Brexit chaos. But time moves on, and I will make our new Councillor, Natalie Chapple, welcome in the Ward. I am sure we will work together to represent the concerns and wishes of all our residents.

From our County Councillor District Council Election Results

West Oxfordshire remains under Conservative control. [For a summary of the results, see p. 19]

Primary school places

More than nine out of ten parents whose children are set to enter the classroom for the first time this September have been offered their first choice of primary school in Oxfordshire. Since 2010 the council has created more than 10,000 new primary school places.

Barbecues

The good weather has meant many of us getting the BBQs out. However, Oxfordshire Fire & Rescue has already been called out to deal with out-of-control grills. Many of these incidents could be avoided by:

- Making sure your barbecue is standing on a flat surface and away from fences, trees and sheds.
- Keeping a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby and don't leave the barbecue unattended.
- Always ensuring you fully inspect the BBQ and cylinder for wear and tear and any damage.

Woodstock library

Members of the public at Woodstock Library can connect their own devices to the Internet via Council supplied WiFi. The Library staff have been instructed on how to connect to the Wi-Fi.

Currently all options are being considered to maintain a permanent library facility within Woodstock. I would urge residents to visit Charlbury and Wood Green in Banbury to see what a new library shared facility could look like. The County Council will work with Woodstock TC and residents before a final decision is taken.

From our Member of Parliament Cotswold Line Upgrades

Our MP Robert Courts has met with the Rail Minister, Andrew Jones, to discuss the need for upgrades to the Cotswold Line, including further redoubling and more frequent services. Robert has pledged to continue to keep up the pressure on all involved to ensure vital railway upgrades for West Oxfordshire.

Refillable water bottles

The 'Refill West Oxfordshire' initiative is part of national award-winning campaign to reduce plastic pollution. It has already won the backing of many local businesses who have agreed to refill people's water bottles free of charge; one is Witney Blanket Hall. Participating businesses are shown on an app to help people find them and can also display a sticker in their window.

Better Mobile Coverage in Rural Areas Robert Courts has joined in calls on the Government to make it a requirement that network operators enable roaming between providers to improve mobile coverage in rural areas. He recognises that a lack of co-ordination between network providers has left many rural areas covered by some but not all the networks. This is hampering economic, educational and leisure opportunities for residents in rural areas and remains a significant brake on growth. Introduction of roaming services between networks would vastly increase the operational coverage for many in West Oxfordshire.

Stonesfield Primary School Forest School

Recently the governors of Stonesfield

School conducted a parental questionnaire to allow parents to contribute to the long-term vision of the school and evaluate current strengths and areas for development. Along with identifying the welcoming community nature of the school and the dedicated, caring, nurturing staff, our Forest School was identified by many as a main strength. We are passionate about the opportunities that our Forest School gives our pupils: outdoor learning (in all seasons and weathers!); developing problem-solving, creativity and independence; and above all learning new skills and having fun. We offer Forest School to our children in Reception, Year 2, and, unlike most schools, Year 4.

We are fortunate to have a brilliant Forest School leader, Sarah Walker, who many of you will also know through the village Scouts. Sarah ensures that every session is unique, with children pushed out of their comfort zones with a smile on their faces. Under Sarah's supervision children have become remarkably skilled with tools: whittling wood into a variety of objects. One parent commented: 'Our child prefers her bow and arrow – made under the watchful eve of Sarah - to her princess dolls at the moment, which is just fantastic.' I have been treated to some interesting delicacies prepared by the children around the campfire, including dandelion omelette, crumpets and nettle tea.

With school budget constraints ever

tightening, we are only in a position to offer our Forest School due to grants. We receive a Sports Premium grant from the Department for Education – it is unclear whether this will be guaranteed beyond 2020 – and are also extremely grateful to the Community Trust for generously funding a day a week. We also rely on the generosity of parent volunteers who give up their time (again in all weathers), get stuck in and help give the children the undisputed highlight of their week.

It was a pleasure to see so many villagers support the school recently at the Village Idiots fundraising gig at the village hall. The school is at the heart of the community and we rely on you to be able to continue to offer the best experiences for our future generations.

Time and again recently we are finding dog mess on the school field and in our Forest School area. We know our parents wait with their dogs at the school gate, so can only conclude this is a villager trespassing on private property, causing a serious health hazard for our pupils. From your Parish Priest

I preached a few weeks ago on Jesus being our good shepherd, and I intended to share this particular story about the 23rd Psalm. I didn't have time in the service in Combe, so I promised I would write it up in my next Letter in June and here it is.

There is a story from yesteryear that says it beautifully. The year was 1850. On the prairies of the Midwest light snow was still falling in March. There was a little log cabin on the prairie in which a little boy, Timmy, was on the verge of death from diphtheria. A Methodist circuit rider came by to visit Timmy. He wanted to see if the boy was all right, since he had heard that he was not doing well. He came into the room to find little Timmy sick in bed.

The circuit riding preacher asked Timmy if he knew how to say the 23rd Psalm.

Timmy replied that he had learned it in the second grade at his Sunday school. He started reciting the Psalm, 'The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.'

The pastor told him he was reciting it much too fast. Timmy tried to say it again; this time more slowly. The pastor decided to teach him how to say the 23rd Psalm in a different way.

He asked him to count the words on his fingers, beginning with his thumb. 'The Lord is my . . .' This way when he uttered the word 'my' he would be holding the fourth finger of his hand. The preacher explained, 'Your parents wear their wedding rings on the fourth finger of their hands. This is the finger of love.' So, if each time Timmy recited 'The Lord is my shepherd, when he grabbed his fourth finger, it would be a reminder that the Lord is his personal shepherd: 'The Lord is MY Shepherd.' This pleased

Timmy and he recited the psalm accordingly. Then the pastor bid Timmy farewell and went on his way.

When he came back to see Timmy it was springtime. He noticed that there was a mound of upturned earth with a cross on it in the backyard. He realised that Timmy had passed away. Timmy's parents spoke about what a good boy Timmy was. Then they described his final night. They had kissed Timmy good night. In the morning when his mother went to check on him, she realised that he had died. But there was something that caught her eye and she found it extremely strange. She noticed that Timmy was holding on to his fourth finger. She asked the pastor. The pastor

could only answer her with tear-filled eyes.

You and I know what it meant. 'The Lord is my shepherd.' Or as Jesus said, 'My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one.'

Jesus, the Good Shepherd knows us all by name, even you and me.


