## **May 2019 Progress Headlines**

- SAFER has recruited an extra 3 volunteers this month taking the total supporting the initiative to 10.
- SAFER now has 2 x 'Speed Survey in Progress' portable road signs that will be displayed in the village during Community Speed Watch (CSW) operations. A schedule of CSW survey dates and village locations is under construction.
- Further meetings with local Villages/Town CSW teams planned for Summer 2019 and beyond to share experience and results. These meetings currently involve: Charlbury, North Leigh, Bladon, Freeland, East End and Stonesfield CSW teams.
- SAFER communications continue online and in The Slate. Thames Valley Police 'Community Speed Watch' warning signs have now been installed at each entrance to Stonesfield.
- OCC to undertake traffic surveys in Stonesfield during June. SAFER team to manage relationships with OCC on traffic issues in future.
- Production of local road safety experiences underway based on the storyline provided by a Stonesfield resident.
- A background paper will be produced covering FORS for SPC to understand the scheme. SPC can then consider using the scheme for development projects in the village. Production of the paper will commence once SAFER launch CSW surveys.
- A near miss on Boot Street involving a Waitrose delivery van has been raised direct with the company for investigation.
- A near miss involving the S3 Bus near the village shop involving 2 x horses has been raised with Stagecoach for investigation.
