CALA Homes appeal dismissed

The CALA Homes appeal against refusal of their planning application for land north of Woodstock Road was dismissed on 21 June by the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State.

In a long and detailed statement, he stated that 'the proposed development would cause significant harm to the character and appearance of the AONB' and that 'the loss of part of the field, which is characteristic of the local landscape, and its replacement by 68 dwellings would represent a highly adverse magnitude of change.'

Oaklands Farm supports biodiversity and Bird Aid

It was a beautiful May evening when Genny and I visited Ollie Stobo and Oaklands Farm to find a new Bird Aid feeding site. Ollie kindly gave us two hours of his time, driving us around his fields, with his Natural England Countryside Mid-tier Stewardship report to give us the facts and figures.

We were delighted to hear that Ollie has currently 4.9 hectares of land planted with Nectar Pollen Flower mix & Winter Bird Food mix, and has replanted 800 metres of hedgerows on his land. His 6800m of in-field hedges (not adjoining roads) are cut only every three years to help wildlife. Hares abound in the fields – we saw six or more while we were there!

In at least five fields, Ollie grows Winter Bird Food mix crop to feed wild birds and help pollinators, including the field down Witney Lane (covered in white campion last year). Bird Aid will start winter feeding on this site in the autumn. Thanks to Ollie for his contribution to supporting wildlife in our countryside as part of his commercial farming practices.

Stonesfield Parish Council

The Parish Council held its latest meeting on 12 June 2019.

The Council discussed planning application 19/01315/FUL and has submitted an objection to this on the basis that the access to the site via the existing driveway is not adequate for existing use (it is single drive access only) and there is a hazardous junction with Church Street, which is a blind corner and not safe to take additional traffic. This change of use is for commercial use and those visiting will not know the area, making this particularly hazardous. In addition, the Council felt that this could set a precedent for further development requests on this land.

Jim Astle represented the Parish fantastically well at the last day of the CALA planning hearing and the Council would like to formally thank him for his work on this. The Council is waiting for a decision from the planning inspector. At this time we are hoping for a decision prior to August 2019. It is difficult to ascertain which way the decision will go.

Michael Heduan provided a report on SAFER, which will be submitted to the website with the minutes. OCC traffic surveys have not yet been done but will hopefully be done soon.

Richard Bishop presented a report to the Parish Council. A copy will be placed on the website with the minutes. There have been reports of the odd property in the village leaving bins outside all week long. Please can residents remember to move bins off the public highway and back on to driveways when it is not a bin collection day.

Cllr G Lawrence reported on the Village Hall. The hall is still waiting for quotes for repair work, which the Village Hall committee is arranging. The Parish Council does have concerns that repair work is not being carried out in a timely manner, and reiterates that the village hall is not a Council asset, and therefore the Council does not have control of the funding and maintenance of the hall.

Cllr G Lawrence also reported that she checks the defibrillator regularly. It has been checked and the battery is currently fine.

Countryfile tickets are available to residents at a discounted rate. Details are on p.5 above and on the website.

The clerk can confirm that replacement signs at Greenfield Road and Farley Close have been requested as these are damaged / in need of repair.

The date of the next Parish Council meeting is Wednesday 10 July, 7.30pm at the village hall; all are welcome. If you have specific questions for the Council or items you would like to discuss, please contact the clerk in advance at stonesfieldpc@gmail.com.

West Oxfordshire District Council

The District Council has had its hands full dealing with current matters and looking to the future. The Council's concern for the wellbeing of all its residents is exemplified especially in the period following elections.

Environmentally, the Scrutiny
Committee considered various important
matters including air quality, which was
deemed to be of concern in central
Witney, particularly in the area around
Bridge Street and the adjacent road
junctions. Also of concern locally and
nationally was the possible curtailing of
the use of single-use plastics. Difficulties
with Thames Water were again aired and
preparations made for the next Water
Day conference were detailed.

The current Disabled Facilities Grant scheme will be increased. The Community Facilities Grant Scheme period for the current request period will be extended to 31 December 2019.

At the recent full Development Control Committee (includes both Uplands and Lowlands Sub-committees), the Mullin Automotive Park on the old airfield in Enstone was debated and decided. Members of interested local groups, representatives of the developer and the architect, Sir Norman Foster, all gave their opinions. Peter Mullin himself spoke about his aspirations and hopes for the area. All were succinct and to the point in their comments. After much discussion, giving all members ample opportunity for expressing their individual views, the decision was finally taken to approve this innovative and exciting scheme.

The newly elected council is settling down to business and it bodes well for the future of West Oxfordshire.

Proposed development at East Witney

West Oxfordshire District Council has launched a public consultation on the East Witney Strategic Development site, which is allocated in the Local Plan for some 450 homes. It is seeking views on the provision of links across the Windrush Valley and into Witney town centre; the type of housing and open space needed and the potential for a new 'community hub' as part of the development.

The consultation is available until 17 July on www.westoxon.gov.uk/spd, at local libraries and other key locations including the District Council offices at Elmfield and the Witney town centre shop. There will also be an exhibition at Cogges Farm on Thursday 4 July between 2pm and 8pm.

From our County Councillor £3.5 million investment for highways

More than more than 50 miles of road across Oxfordshire are to be given a new lease of life thanks to the 'surface dressing' technique which waterproofs and extends the life of roads. The cost of the work is in the region of £3.5m.

Oxfordshire County Council takes road repairs and maintenance seriously and has put around £25m extra into fixing highways in this and last year, as part of a £120 million investment in infrastructure. After a short period of bedding

in, loose chippings are swept away and the surfaces are indistinguishable from any other except for the absence of cracks and potholes. Skid resistance is also improved.

As part of the surface dressing programme this year, the County Council will be trying out a technique called 'Surface Seal' – an additional treatment added to a newly dressed road, which prevents defects, cracks, and potholes.

Electric vehicles

Oxfordshire County Council has taken delivery of a new fleet of electric cars and vans for its fire and rescue service and general staff pool car resource. The vehicles can travel up to 160 miles on a single charge.

The County Council is committed to being carbon neutral by 2030.

Stonesfield Folk Dance Club

June was a very special month for us, with our 47th annual Folk Dance Weekend when we welcomed dancers from all corners of UK. With one of the best folk bands in the UK, 'The Night Before' with the fantastic Nicky McConkey on fiddle, we danced the weekend away with dances being called by Andrew Swaine & Daisy Black – two of the best, who did not disappoint with a mixed programme of traditional, contra, square and Playford dances.

Daisy, who is regularly on BBC Radio 3, was commissioned by Stonesfield Folk Dance Club to adapt the story of William Kempe's 'Nine Days Wonder' when he danced all the way from London to Norwich in nine days back in 1599.

The Club also produced a CD featuring Alan Kimber-Nickelson singing a selection of English folk ballads. Alan was at the Folk Dance Weekend and sang to great acclaim many of the songs; each of the dancers was given a copy of the CD.

It is now the start of the Folk Dance Festival Season and between now and the end of August many of our members will be attending Festivals around the country.

From your Parish Priest

I hope you are all well and looking forward to what you have planned for the summer break. I look forward to the summer with warmer weather (maybe) and the sense of ease that the sunshine can bring.

Whatever you have planned, I hope that it will be a time of refreshment and a time to recharge your batteries. For me, I find it difficult to plan holidays a year in advance. My yearly calendar gets booked up a year in advance as far as weddings and services are concerned, and I have to book blocks of time without knowing what we are going to fill them with so that I can plan my own recreation.

Speaking of recreation, I believe that we neglect our physical and emotional health at our peril. I was listening to a Radio 4 programme concerning mental health issues and how our lifestyle these

days is contributing to a decline in people's wellbeing. It occurred to me that we ought to include in that simple menu our spiritual health too.

As I talk to people in my daily work, I know that there is a hunger for peace of heart and mind that is almost universally sought after. Roman Catholic Worship Pentecost and Ascension

Pentecost was that moment in the life of the Church which signalled that everything that followed would be different from everything that went before. Most importantly, Pentecost tells us that Christ's universal message will be understood by all:

When Pentecost day came round, the Apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fine; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech (Acts of the Apostles 2:1–11).

Further, the traditional rituals by which the followers of Christ had lived their lives were replaced with others which we are told in the Acts of the Apostles: 'It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials' (Acts 15:22–9.) In other words, focus on the important message that Christ gave us through His life and sacrifice of Himself.

in June we celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The Ascension of our Lord signals the end of his earthly mission and demonstrates incontrovertibly the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. It was also a homecoming for Jesus as he returned to his Father in Heaven, signalling to us that we too may follow him to heaven should we so wish. Then, we too, like the Apostles at Pentecost, may share the 'marvels of God' (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11).
