We can confirm that the Stonesfield flu Clinic will be on Tuesday 22 October, from 2–2.30pm at the Village Hall.

Please advise the surgery beforehand if you wish to attend this clinic in order that we can provide the appropriate amount of vaccines. This year's vaccines are age specific. Those eligible for a flu jab are:

- Anyone aged 65 on 31 March 2020
- Anyone with a chronic condition, e.g. Diabetes, COPD, Heart, Liver, Neurological, or Kidney disease
- Asthmatics who are on steroids
- Anyone who is immunosuppressed, e.g. had an organ transplant or on chemotherapy
- Pregnant women
- Carers in receipt of a carer's allowance
- People in residential homes

Transport for same-day doctors' appointments

Under the Stonesfield Voluntary Transport Scheme, we normally take a day or two to arrange transport, as it may be necessary to contact several volunteers for each request before we can find a driver who is available at the right time. However, we have been talking about how we could help in the case where you need to phone the doctor's surgery first thing in the morning to get an appointment, and may then need transport at short notice. Most of our drivers have agreed that unless they have other commitments, they would be able to offer lifts at short notice; that is, the same morning or the same day. We will therefore be offering this service from the beginning of October, and will review it at the end of the year, or earlier if it becomes unsustainable.

I hope this is a useful extension of our service and we will do our best to make it work. If we are unable to help you on a particular day, please understand that it is because we are only volunteers and have other demands on our time.

CALA Appeal

CALA Homes' appeal has been dismissed by the inspector, but is now being put to the High Court. The SPC are putting together a response to the court, but Barrister costs will be significant and it is unlikely that SPC will be able to send legal representation. Updates will follow as we have these. Cllr David Brown (Chair), the Clerk, and Councillors, with support, are prioritizing this and this month's council meeting was brought forward to 4 September to accommodate urgency of this review.

West Oxfordshire District Council

At the time of writing with the Brexit debate in full spate, the District Council is hard at work reviewing its provisions for the fallout from a 'no-deal' scenario.

Combe, politically, is peaceful with no real controversies to divert from the pleasures of early autumn weather.

Stonesfield, on the other hand, is bubbling with anxiety following the news that Cala Homes Ltd have appealed to the Secretary of State for a Judicial Review of the decision of the Government Inspector to dismiss their appeal against refusal to develop land off the Woodstock Road.

The WODC legal team and the Sustainable Stonesfield Group have submitted strong witness statements and legal arguments to support the decisions to refuse. The Review Judge, if past precedent holds good, will question the various protocols followed by the Inspector and ascertain whether due weight had been given to all the evidence from both sides, should rule in favour of the Inspector's decision.

Whilst it is not possible to prophesy the end result – it's out of all our hands now, the village as a whole must recognize how well served we have been in the efforts of Jim Astle and the entire committee of 'SUSTO'. The evidence given on our behalf was cogent, direct, forceful, and completely truthful. Stonesfield can now only await this final throw of the dice.

Before my next report to our villages, WODC will be holding another 'Water Day', when Thames Water and the Environment Agency will once again be required to justify their actions (or lack of action) with regard to sewage disposal and the lamentable state of the water quality of the Windrush, the Evenlode, and other tributaries of the Thames in West Oxfordshire. Also, hopefully, by then the abandoned car in the Evenlode below Swan Bridge will have been successfully removed. I am at present in consultation with the relevant agencies to that end.

Police move into the Woodstock fire Station

Woodstock's neighbourhood policing team has relocated to their new base at Woodstock fire Station, where they will share premises with colleagues from Oxfordshire County Council fire and Rescue Service.

Woodstock Library

As you are aware, there have been structural issues with the walls of the former Woodstock Library, which were uncovered during routine maintenance and health and safety inspections last year by Oxfordshire County Council operations team. Further extensive surveys revealed that the building on Hensington Road was damaged beyond economic repair and since then the County Council has been preparing the site for demolition.

Work is about to start on demolishing the Woodstock Library very shortly. The current plan is that works are due to start during the week beginning 16 September 2019, however, the start date could be brought forward on the advice of surveyors who are monitoring the condition of the structure.

The county council remains committed to finding a permanent home for the provision of a library. In the meantime, a full library service will continue to be temporarily provided in The Oxfordshire Museum. This includes books, public access internet, activities (stay, play, and learn), Wi-fi, printing, and photocopying.

I asked Brian Clarke if he knew anything about us winning The Howe-Browne Cup, but he said he was too young at the time to remember! 


