North Leigh Roman Villa

North Leigh Roman Villa's mosaic house was opened on 14 and 15 September as part of English Heritage's Open Days weekend. The warm, late summer weather meant that over 400 people enjoyed the beauty of the second and third century AD North Leigh site in glorious sunshine. A new group of volunteers from a range of neighbouring villages, working with English Heritage, staffed the open days. Their plan is to begin a regular pattern of openings for the mosaic in summer 2020.

The first open days by North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers proved very encouraging. Visitors were delighted to see the mosaic, sometimes for the first time up close, sometimes having waited many years to do so. The open days doubled the numbers of people wishing to volunteer at the site, and raised to over 50 the number of 'Friends' of the villa who left a contact email in order to stay informed about future openings and events on site. Donations to improve the site for visitors raised £126. All told a brilliant result on a lovely weekend.

Stonesfield Parish Council (SPC) SAFER Working Group – Report from Cllr M Heduan

Community Speed Watch (CSW) Surveys continue in Stonesfield, all of which have been well supported by the SAFER team. Whilst no vehicles have been recorded travelling at 36mph or above, residents have shown overwhelming support for what SAFER is doing. The sight of the SAFER team in their Hi-Viz jackets seems to have a beneficial calming effect on Stonesfield traffic.

A44 junction with B4437

A meeting took place at the Duke of Marlborough pub on 25 September. Present were Cllr Ian Hudspeth, Linda Bull, Patrick Willmore, Lindsey Thornton, and Cllr Mick Heduan. The concerns of Stonesfield residents were explained to Cllr Hudspeth, with examples of the anecdotal comments from *NextDoor*.

Transport Hub

A meeting has been requested with Blenheim Estates to better understand the so-called 'Transport Hub' for the Blenheim Estate.

Dog fouling

There are continuing reports of dog fouling on the playing fields and around the village. Please can people be reminded to clear up after your dogs. Fines can be imposed and people will be reported if seen. The dog warden has been made aware.

Sustainable Stonesfield / CALA AppealOur solicitor explained that the process

for the appeal is that a single judge in the High Court looks at the papers and acts as a sifting mechanism. It is confirmed that he has rejected the grounds of appeal. It is open to CALA to serve notice that they wish, nonetheless, to go to the full court to argue the matter in open court. At this stage we have no further update.

Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty Cllr David Brown advised that there are calls for the AONB to be a National Park. However, an MP wants the AONB to be reviewed as he feels it is too big a meaning for the AONB. No confirmed updates, but something that we will

Allotment holders have been contacted for their annual payments. There are still allotment spaces available.



West Oxfordshire District Council

There have been some interesting developments at District recently. Firstly, a new post at Cabinet level has been created with the portfolio holder being responsible for developing a strategy for Climate Change. David Harvey becomes the new cabinet member. As this is a vitally important and relevant area, his





work will help to bring West Oxfordshire into the forefront of a global and national debate.

Council has also developed an amended Council Plan for the ensuing years. It concentrates on several aspects of life in the Oxfordshire Cotswolds, including the provision of necessary housing of types to suit a wide range of residents. The plan takes to heart the depressing fact that a prospective house purchaser on the average wage for Oxfordshire would need to spend more than 60% of his wage to purchase a single-bed flat. Consequently, there is a real need to make 'affordable' properties much more affordable than is possible under the national scheme of a reduction of 20% on the market value. Blenheim Estates have gone some way towards this goal, but much more needs to be done. 'Pods' for example, for single people or couples?

Electric vehicle charging points are included in the plan. District has designated three areas and has put them out to tender. So far there are at least two firms interested in each of the areas. It is interesting to note that an average charging point attracts installation costs of around £5,000.

The notion of re-classifying the Cotswold Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty as the Cotswold National Park is receiving a very mixed response. Farmers in the area are unconvinced of the benefits and fear the effects of a widespread increase in visitors, both pedestrian and vehicular. Others, too, find it difficult to appreciate the potential advantages.

By the time you read this, our 'Water Day' will be over. The two main institutions concerned, Thames Water and the Environment Agency, will once again have been subjected to the ire of West Oxford's residents. I guess they will once again have promised to do better and more to improve our water quality and our waste disposal. Am I really optimistic? Well . . .

Also, hopefully, the long-awaited Brexit solutions may be announced. Again, are we confident? . . . ! They say 'All things come to those who wait.' We have waited, but will we receive?

From our County Councillor Woodstock Library

Oxfordshire County Council is committed to keeping a library facility within Woodstock and options need to be considered. Whilst the current size of the temporary facility is not as large as previously, the opening hours have increased by nearly 50%, giving more opportunity for residents to use the library. There have been some innovative local co-locations in Charlbury and Wood Green in Banbury, which have increased the library hours even more. I think it's worth visiting either or both of those libraries to see what can be achieved by co-location with other facilities.



1st Stonesfield Scout Group Amazing people wanted!

The Scout Movement is frequently in the national news. While this is often in a positive light, with ambassadors like Bear Grylls or the Duchess of Cambridge, last

month, sadly, it was the shortage of adult volunteers in scouting at an all-time high, which featured in the headlines.

In Stonesfield, we are very fortunate to have a lively scout group of 70 young people, with a Beaver, Cub, and Scout section in the village, as well as several local Explorer units nearby. Our catchment area is huge, however, covering Woodstock, Combe, and several other surrounding villages – our waiting list clearly reflects this.

The first section of the 1st Stonesfield Scout Group was registered in 1948, and since then, the group has grown and provided decades of amazing experiences for many young people, some of whom still live in the village and are now taking part again as adults.

Just as important as working with the young people at their weekly meetings, camps, and activities, is all the work that goes on behind the scenes. This work is done by the Scout Executive Committee, which comprises a GSL (Group Scout Leader – whose role is to manage and support the group and its leaders to ensure it runs effectively), a chairperson, a treasurer, a secretary, and various other roles, including section representatives, a fundraising committee, and event organisers, without whom the group would not function.

In recent years, membership of our Exec has diminished, and the section leaders have gradually taken on much of the running of events, in addition to the weekly meetings.

We no longer have a GSL, our treasurer is due to leave at the next AGM, and the scout hut is about to be demolished,



requiring a team of people to manage the new build as well as to fundraise for it. And as if that weren't enough, section leaders are covering the recent departure of the Cub leaders between them. All of these roles are essential to the future of the group – without them the group will close!

From your Parish Priest

I sometimes share with you letters sent to me by an old friend, the Reverend Canon J. John. He sent me this letter a few days ago and I would like to share with you an abridged version because his letter was 1,000 words long and I only have 500.

The subject of his letter was to encourage us all about keeping the faith. He set out ten priorities that you and I could practice in our lives. They were:

1 Prioritise God and His word

He said it sounds old fashioned, but there are no short cuts with regard to connecting with God in our lives. He and his wife Killy read scripture together in the morning and then last thing at night. His idea is that God is the vine and we are the branches and we need to keep connected

2 Prioritise Godly thinking.

It tells us in the book of Matthew to love the Lord your God with all your heart. (Matt 22: 36–37). I take this to mean that we are to love God with our emotions, wills, and our intellects. The intellect is easily neglected. In the past it used to be that part of being a believer in Jesus was to immerse yourself in Christian truth, to read books, to discuss theology, and to critically evaluate what you thought and did in the light of the Bible.

3 Prioritise Godly living.

Those who leave the Christian faith often say that they did so on the basis of reasoned arguments. But it nevertheless seems noteworthy that those who proclaim their departure from Christianity's beliefs have often parted company with its morality and quite frequently beforehand. Be careful how you live!



4 Prioritise spiritual participation.

There are those who love to target Christians who have lost connection with God's people. Many individuals who pride themselves on being spiritual lone wolves are no more than lost sheep: a fact fatally brought home to them when the jaws of a genuine wolf close around them. Stay deeply and regularly involved with God's people. Remain in the flock!

5 Prioritise the positives.

It is said that a piece of grit in an oyster can produce a pearl, but my advice is don't bank on it. Many of these sad stories from those leaving the faith are full of difficulties, anger, and negative attitudes. One well-trodden pathway into the wilderness involves becoming someone who is always complaining and always against something. One of the easiest ways to justify your departure from any organisation, including the church, is to convince yourself that it is somehow unworthy of your commitment. Stay positive!

That last remark I know is difficult at this time of political unrest, but it is, for all of that, the best way to travel.

Dear J. John has five more priorities that I will share with you, perhaps next time, but for now stay safe, grounded in love, and of course, D.F.T.W. See you soon.

Roman Catholic Worship What makes a saint?

It was much in the news in October that Cardinal John Henry Newman was canonised by Pope Francis on Sunday 13 October, the first English person to be canonised in 43 years. While St John Henry is most well known for his theological teaching and educational commitment, it was his compassion for the sick, the imprisoned, and the

desperately needy in which he tried to imitate Christ which made him outstanding. To be formally canonised, the potential saint must have demonstrated a 'life of heroic virtue'. The Church further refines that phrase 'heroic virtue' by adding that they 'lived in fidelity to God's grace', that is, recognising the primacy of Christ's teachings. Many saints struggled along the way, often leading lives of chaos and distance from God: St Augustine of Hippo, St Francis of Assisi, and St Ignatius of Lovola are examples of saints who seemed surprised by their own later inclinations to turn towards God and away from their previous lives. Saints put God and others at the centre of their lives rather than themselves, often giving service to those most in need like Saint Teresa of Calcutta. We can all aim to be saints: by helping others, by being compassionate, being generous to those in need, and, like St John Henry and countless other named saints, we too can strive to imitate Christ.
