News from West Oxfordshire

Botley West Solar Farm

WODC has asked the Botley West Solar Farm developer to make significant improvements to their plans in response to the Scoping Report .

WODC has advised that the developer needs to do more to consider issues such as flooding, wildlife protection, why this site has been selected, the impact on farming, housing, recreation and heritage among a wide range of topics we have been asked to comment on.

The next stage will show the detailed proposals that will be consulted on in public where all residents will be able to give their views. Residents are encouraged to take part when it is live to make their views known.

The Council has previously expressed its disappointment that the proposal will bypass the local planning process, limiting input and decision making at a local level. The next round of public consultation is expected in Autumn 2023 according to the developer's website. Residents can find more information at www.botleywest.co.uk The Botley West Solar Farm is a national level proposal being brought forward by a private developer and ultimately the Planning Inspectorate and Secretary of State will be making a decision on whether it is approved.

Expanding electric fleet will help keep towns green and clean

The job of keeping the towns of Carterton and Woodstock clean will be greener following the purchase of two new fully electric street sweepers by WODC as the authority strives for greater sustainability to benefit the local environment and the communities it serves.

The sweepers are the latest additions to the Council's growing fleet of fully-electric vehicles as it continues to champion greener transport choices. With zero tailpipe emissions and quiet to operate, the new Green Machine Ze500 sweepers are well suited to be used in the two towns' residential areas where they will be used to clear road gutters and cleanse pavements as well as other pedestrianised areas.

Collectively they could save over 19,000 kg CO2 per annum - the equivalent of saving 70,000 miles being driven in an average petrol car.

Buyers beware!

WODC is warning potential buyers of land in West Oxfordshire to do proper checks before purchasing land.

Councillor Carl Rylett said, 'We have been contacted by numerous people who are

confused about the sale of plots of land in West Oxfordshire that are being sold with adverts saying they have future potential for development.

Some of those contacting us are asking about buying land to build their own home when the likelihood of planning permission being granted is very low. Some of these plots have even had planning permission for development turned down on numerous occasions before being sold as individual plots.

We are calling out to anyone looking to purchase land for development to make sure they are fully aware of what planning is required for what they want to do and to get professional advice, so they go into the purchase with the full information.

From our MP

Funds for Farmers

I was delighted by the recent announcement to award farmers and foresters across West Oxfordshire with £165,527 in funding as part of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affair's 'Farming Equipment and Technology Fund'.

This funding aims to help growers boost farm productivity, reduce waste and cut input costs, as well as increase environmental sustainability.

On top of this, I was very pleased to welcome the Minister for Food, Farming & Fisheries, Mark Spencer MP to West Oxfordshire recently to meet with local farmers.

It was important to meet with the Minister and for local farmers to be given the opportunity to have an open and honest discussion with him about the challenges they are facing and stress the importance of supporting farming businesses in West Oxfordshire and across the UK.

Local Nature Recovery Strategy

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs awarded Oxfordshire County Council £238,000 to work on a Local Nature Recovery Strategy.

Through the adoption of a more localised approach to nature recovery, local communities will have greater autonomy to identify areas to create, enhance and restore habitat to maximise environmental benefits. This funding comes as part of a £14 million government package to regenerate our natural environment nationally.

August saw the launch of the first round of funding in the £25 million Species Survival Fund, targeted towards environmental charities, voluntary organisations, local authorities, national parks and AONBs and their partners, as well as eligible farmers. The fund will support early action for the 2030 Species Abundance Target, supporting the creation and restoration of wildlife-rich habitats, including on protected sites.

Thames Valley Police

I was pleased to hear that the number of police constables in Thames Valley Police's Neighbourhood is set to double.

This announcement is hugely welcome and will mean 80 more officers are available to

deal with local crime across our area. This is a fantastic move to re-establish neighbourhood policing at a local level and I know is a very welcome and reassuring boost to our area as well as all other areas across TVP's neighbourhood.

Unlimited fines announced for water companies

The Government has announced new laws to scrap the cap on penalties for polluters, giving regulators the power to issue unlimited fines on Water companies.

Following a consultation that received widespread support the Government has responded positively with new laws to bring forward more investment, stronger regulation and tougher enforcement.

Future fines and penalties from water companies will be re-invested into the government's new Water Restoration Fund aimed at delivering on-the-ground improvements to water quality, and support local groups and community-led schemes which help to protect our waterways.

l'm a reader

Nicky Holland, 63, is a specialist mentor at Oxford Brooks University, supporting students through a variety of challenges, including mental health problems, autism and ADHD.

'I'm a library fanatic, I've used libraries since I was a toddler. A librarian once told me when I went back the next week: 'You can't change the books, you can't have read them all', but I had! In those days (the 1960s), library users were regarded as a nuisance, thought of mostly as just making the place untidy. It's totally different now, everyone is welcome. The first library I remember was ten minutes' walk from my childhood home in Swindon.

At Stonesfield library, I discovered Lindsey Davis. I just love her; she writes detective novels set in A.D. 70 and onwards. She's a classicist. Currently I'm reading Terry Pratchett's *Discworld*, which I've read loads of times. It's so clever and funny, like a (Gulliver's Travels' author) Jonathan Swift style reflection of our world through another mirror. Terry Pratchett turns all our understanding of being human on its head, which appeals to my fascination with how people think.'

For many years now, Nicky has lived with rheumatoid arthritis, which makes holding and handling books difficult. Consequently, she has switched to a Kindle, which is lighter and means if she needs to read in the middle of the night, she can switch its backlight on and read herself back to sleep without waking husband, Harry.

Nicky is heavily involved with the Stonesfield Players, our thriving amateur dramatic society. She always wrote as a child but was discouraged from a writing career by a narrow-minded headmistress. Proving it's never too late, though, Nicky has recently written two short plays that she is now directing for autumn performances.

The first, *Same Table Next Week*, focuses on a woman who sees books as a vital way to make friends. The second, which will be performed in November - so there is still plenty of time to bag your seats – is centred around the recent, true story discovery by Nicky of letters hidden for decades, which were sent to Nicky's then teenaged mother by her favourite uncle while he was on active service in France during World War Two. The two plays, while very different, both have at their core a message about the power of the written word.

Creative inspiration can strike at any time, particularly, she says, when gardening, which is why she's not a big listener to audiobooks while she works: 'I enjoy thinking time. When I'm pulling up the weeds, my brain will pull the threads of what I'm writing together and sometimes I have to rush back inside to write it all down.'

Nicky's now grown-up daughters, on the other hand, however, were enthusiastic audiobook fans. One used Stephen Fry's narration of Harry Potter to help her sleep; this technique worked so well that for some time afterwards, like Pavlov's dogs, 'if she heard Fry's voice talking about anything, she'd fall asleep, no matter where she was.' Nicky is now looking into Oxfordshire libraries' own free e-book service, in addition to Kindle and you can too! North Leigh History Society

In addition, best-selling author Shrabani Basu will give 'Spy Princess' talk at Ditchley Park at 7pm on Wednesday 6 September 2023 at Ditchley Park. Tickets sold raise funds for Soldiers of Oxfordshire Trust, in memory of former Trustee and friend Major Tom Shannon. The talk will highlight the story of Noor Inayat Khan, the first woman radio operator to be infiltrated into occupied France in 1943. Based on interviews with her family, colleagues and secret service records, Shrabani Basu traces the journey of Noor Inavat Khan from her early life in Paris as a writer and a musician to her recruitment by the British secret service, her valuable work for the Allies, and final death in Dachau concentration camp in September 1944.

As her circuit collapsed around her, she remained the last link with London and refused to abandon her post despite the dangers. She was posthumously awarded the George Cross for her extraordinary bravery, and France honoured her with the Croix de Guerre.

This talk has been organised in celebration of the life of Major Tom Shannon, a friend of Basu and former Trustee of the Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum, who sadly passed away in August 2022. Proceeds from ticket sales from this event support Soldiers of Oxfordshire Trust. It is planned to be the first in a series of lectures held in his memory.

The co-founder of Oxford Metrics, Tom had served as a Reservist in the Australian Army, and in the Territorial Army in Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire. Alongside his Trusteeship of the county's military museum, he was secretary of the Army Benevolent Fund in Buckinghamshire and a long serving chairman of the Oxford Club.

The venue for this event will be the magnificent Ditchley Park, with the ticket price including a donation to the museum, as well as drinks and canapés.

From the Rector – New Learning

I always associate September with the beginning of a new school or college year, and I wonder whether you do too. Many of us have been shaped by years of study, or have been scarred by it, or have felt our lives punctuated by ushering children through the long process of education. When September comes, our children and young people, after a summer of relaxed days, time with grandparents, family holidays, travel with friends or damp festivals, have to begin another academic year and relearn the art of sitting still, listening, reading and thinking. For some this will be a delight, and for others, it will be rather less so. As this September arrives, I am conscious of how much has changed in the world of learning in recent vears. The use of tablet computers in school, smart boards, the digitisation of

libraries and widespread access to online resources was already well underway before Covid struck, but since then the revolution in learning has been extraordinary. Like many of my age, I use the internet a lot, but I now feel like a dinosaur for also using reference books, or for taking actual books on holiday. And I wonder whether the Artificial Intelligence revolution will soon change things again.

My father died a year ago this month, but left behind lots of books, which I hope to read one day. His own father had been a postman in East London, who attended improving lectures and concerts in his limited free time, but passed on to my father a love of learning. Whether we get our learning from documentaries, on the internet, from magazines or from books, I believe it is important for us all to be lifelong learners, to be open to new ideas, to insights which will help us to experience life with a new vitality. The world has so much to teach us, and so many things to share, which can enlarge our vision and challenge our assumptions at any age. There are always new things to learn, to experience, to feel and to know. Not novelty or distraction, but insight, understanding and wisdom. One of the things which has been missed by many people in recent decades is an understanding of the Bible, its context and its message, even though it underpins so much of our language, literature, culture, politics, belief and history. It is never too late to learn a language, an instrument, to encounter another culture or to ride a unicycle, and neither is it too late to begin to understand the riches of the Bible's message of love, justice and grace. If you are interested in learning how the Christian message could change your own

understanding of life, the universe and everything, please get in touch - as we hope to begin a group who will meet weekly to learn and discuss together this autumn.

Transfiguration

On August 6 we celebrated the Feast of the Transfiguration, an important feast in the liturgical calendar. Most denominations in the Christian Communion commemorate Jesus' Transfiguration which is recorded in three of the four Gospels. We are told (Mark 9:2–13; Matthew 17:1–13; Luke 9:28–36) of the occasion upon which Jesus Christ took three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John, up on a mountain, where Moses and Elijah appeared and Jesus was transfigured, his face and clothes becoming dazzlingly bright.

The Transfiguration reiterates God as a threefold figure, all coequal: (1) as Creator, Lord of the history of salvation, Father, and Judge, as revealed in the Old Testament; (2) as the Lord who, in the incarnated figure of Jesus Christ, lived among human beings and was present in their midst as the "Resurrected One": and (3) as the Holv Spirit: the Giver of Life and Love. Matt. 17. [5] 'And as he was yet speaking, behold a bright cloud overshadowed them. And lo a voice out of the cloud, saying: This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased: hear ye him.' This in effect repeats that of Jesus' Baptism: Matt 3. (16-17) 'And Jesus being baptised, forthwith came out of the water: and lo, the heavens were opened to him: and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove, and coming upon him. And behold

a voice from heaven saying: This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.'

The Transfiguration represents the end of Jesus' earthly mission to humanity; thereafter it is His apostles and disciples who are charged with spreading the 'good news' of the Gospels and Christ's teaching. Their continuing mission is to transfigure us all, by reminding us that Jesus was fully God and wholly man who lived, died and was resurrected for us.
